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Waple. The Name. The Legend.

A History. Part Five.

Part four of *Waple. The Name. The Legend.* left us with Oliver P. Wapledink guiding the brothers Chet, Chic and Biff into a career of three-on-one handicap matches and the start of one of the greatest forces ever unleashed into the depths of professional wrestling; Waplemania.

The Wonderful Waple Brothers were not necessarily good, (a 3 on 1 loss to Dwane Gill will prove that), but they could be crafty upon occasion. On any given day, anyone could bear witness to history in the making, for the Waple brothers, being regular guys, would plot and plan in a very special gathering place. This place... this magical and most wondrous place was, and still is, Rio Bravo at Town Center Mall, Kennesaw, Georgia... second home to the Wonderful Waple Brothers.

One of the brother's best

schemes was in a match where Chic and Chet were pitted against the Mega Powers. Normally, a preliminary tag team would obviously lose to a duo such as Hulk Hogan and Randy Savage, but Oliver drilled this kooky idea into the brother's heads that they could win.

This was the plan: Before the match was to begin, Biff would dress himself as the lovely Elizabeth and then come to ringside with the Mega Powers. At one point in the match, Chic would hurl himself over the second rope and onto Liz (Biff). Hogan would then pick her (him) up into his pythons and carry her (him) to the locker room where Oliver would chloroform Hogan into a deep sleep. During his absence, Chic and Chet would proceed to pummel Macho Man into ignominious defeat.

All went according to plan

during the match. Chic tripped out onto Biff and the Hulkster brought him into the back where Oliver knocked him out. Biff then ran back to the ring to help finish off Savage... but it was too late. The damage had already been done. Chet and Chic had been double-pinned and Savage had already gone to look for Elizabeth. Hogan then ran into the ring, ripped off another shirt (except for that part at the bottom he never manages to get), threw Biff into the ropes and finished him off with his boot to the face (which, by the way, knocked Biff goofy) and the ol' leg drop. So went the plan.

The brothers were not discouraged. They knew that there would be other matches, and they knew there would be other plans. But, there was one thing they did not know: Where did they hide Elizabeth?

Biff: Well, there you go. That's why he's the brains.

Chic: It was against a tough team of Louie Spicolli and Barry Horowitz. We gave them a run for their money.

Biff: It was a match they'll never remember.

WW: What would your dream match be?

Chic: I don't want to say anything to offend my brothers, 'cause I love wrestling with my brother, but I would love it if, just once, I could wrestle with my mentor, Chic Donovan, and we would win the match together.

Biff: You mean without the rest of us?

Chic: You guys could come, too. Ooh, you could be the guest referee. Even though Gunther was our

father, Chic Donovan is the one who taught me all the veteran moves that I can't use today.

Biff: I don't think anyone ever wanted to team up with Gunther.

Chic: He was a singles man.

Biff: Not by choice, necessarily.

WW: What does your diet consist of?

"When it comes to the dark, I'm a fraidy-cat"

Biff: I know this one! I only eat one food: Chili con Queso. Oh, and pizza... and buffalo wings... and peanut butter.

Chic: For me, it's a steady diet of grease and fat, whether it's hamburgers, french fries or Chili con Queso.

WW: Do you guys work out?

Chic: What do you mean?

WW: Which are your favorite pepper grains, black or gray?

According to **Bobby Heenan**, this is actually a revenge match for Vader's manager, **Harley Race**, who lost his Heavyweight Championship belt to **Dustin's father, Dusty**, back in 1979.... Speaking of Dustin Rhodes, he and Sting were in a tag team match against **Arn Anderson** and Bunkhouse Bunk recently. The peroxide pair were victorious. Sting had faced Anderson the week before, and while he had the

Scorpion Death Lock on The Enforcer, **Ming** clobbered him from behind. Everyone is glad to see Sting in the squared circle again.

Waple Documentary in Pre-Production

We want to make a documentary about the Waple Brothers."

This event seemed like it might be pretty cool when I looked at the scheduled matches, but my feelings soon changed while I sat through this below-average pay-per-view event. It seemed that everything I've seen so far this year was redone in this event, and there were no original ideas to hold my interest.

The tone for the evening was set with the Television Title on the line in a match between the champion, Johnny B. Badd, and another WWF Johnny-come-lately, the Honkey Tonk Man. It ended up in a draw (Yawn) when the time limit expired. Little did I know that this was to foreshadow the rest of the evening.

The Tag Team Title Belts were next up for grabs, as Pretty Wonderful grabbed them from Stars and Stripes in an unexciting match.

In an attempt to copy the Hart Brothers feud in the WWF, the Sullivans had their own Brother

vs. Brother match. Unlike the Hart matches, it was short and sloppy. Kevin got counted out.

Dustin Rhodes won his first real match in a while when he pinned Arn Anderson. Arn decided to beat him up afterwards. Been there. Seen that. Bought the T-shirt.

"Stunning" Steve Austin was (SURPRISE!) disqualified when he threw "Hacksaw" Jim Duggan out of the ring while trying to recapture the U.S. Heavyweight Belt.

Vader and the Guardian Angel were at it again. Even though he's not "The Boss" anymore, the Guardian Angel did the "Bossman Slam" on Vader, and instead of pinning Vader, he went after... Harley Race. Needless to say, Vader came up behind the Angel and got an easy pin.

The one bright spot of the evening looked like it might be the tag team match between The Nasty Boys and Bunkhouse Buck/ Terry Funk. There was no

gratuitous violence, no broken bones, and worst of all, no blood. The only mildly amusing part was when Jerry Saggs piledrived Terry Funk on a pumpkin, and the pumpkin exploded.

The one match I wasn't particularly excited about was the third Hogan/ Flair match in four months. This match, however, made up for the rest of the evening's mediocrity. I don't feel it was as good as their match at Bash, but it was great to see two experienced veterans get in the ring together. (Ed. Check out the Waple Brothers Ratings of this match elsewhere in this issue.)

Overall, I was very disappointed in this event. The WCW events in 1994 have blown away the WWF events (except for this year's Royal Rumble), and there have been more of them. I hope WCW comes up with some different matchups and new ideas for Starcade '94, because I'm sick of seeing the same stuff over and over.

or five feet onto his opponent's head, giving him some sort of leg scissor/ Frankensteiner thing (big breath... and out). That was just neat.

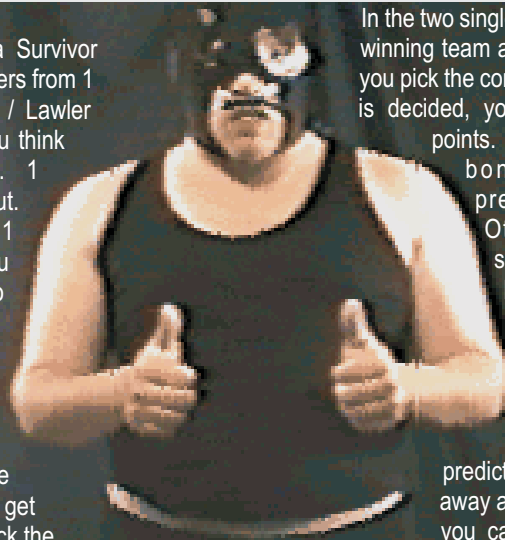
